IDIONS: THE DEVIL

BETTER THE DEVIL YOU KNOW (THAT THE ONE YOU DON'T KNOW)

Used to say you would rather deal with a person you already know, even though you don't like them, than with a person you don't know, that could be even worse

BETWEEN THE DEVIL AND THE DEEP BLUE SEA

In a difficult situation where there are two equally unpleasant choices

SPEAK OF THE DEVIL

Used when someone you are talking about just appears

PLAY THE DEVIL'S ADVOCATE

To express an opinion which you may not agree with but which is very different from what other people have been saying, in order to make the argument more interesting

THE DEVIL IN DISGUISE

Something or someone that appears to be good, useful, or benevolent, but that in reality proves to be the opposite



DEVIL-MAY-CARE (ATTITUDE/MANNER)

If you say that someone has a devil-may-care attitude, you mean that they seem relaxed and do not seem worried about the consequences of their actions

IDLE HANDS ARE THE DEVIL'S TOOLS

When one is unoccupied or has nothing to do, one is more likely to cause or get into trouble

THE DEVIL LOOKS AFTER HIS OWN

Used to explain how good things can happen to bad people, how evil people are often prosperous or well taken care of
